The Science Dimensions program focuses on opportunities for students to collaborate, work in teams to devise solutions, perform hands-on experiments, build models, and journal in science notebooks. The goal is to prepare our students to master the concepts and skills included in the New Jersey Student Learning Standards.

Science Dimensions lessons begin with a problem to solve or a discrepant event or phenomenon to explain, which lays the groundwork for students to explore science in the same way real-life scientists do, by starting with a question. This feature provides intrinsic motivation to spark curiosity and serves as the context for the three-dimensional learning and hands-on activities throughout the lessons. As a result, students are motivated to critically think and construct explanations of *how* and *why*. Additionally, the Science Dimensions program and district curricula are aligned to the New Jersey Student Learning Standards, allowing each student to establish meaningful connections between and among lesson topics.
